Brandon James Balevre, age 33, loving partner of 16 years to Jessica Parker, passed away unexpectedly on Monday, January 12, 2026, at his home.

Born on May 8, 1992, in Salem, Ohio, Brandon was the beloved son of Randy Allen Balevre and Dana Jane Ehrenberg Balevre. He was a graduate of Liberty High School, Class of 2010, and went on to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree from Clemson University in 2016. A gifted and passionate musician, Brandon had a deep love for music, finding joy in playing his guitar and writing songs that reflected his heart and creativity. He was an avid outdoorsman who cherished time spent fly fishing and embraced nature whenever possible. Always eager to learn and try new things, he had recently taken up beekeeping, a hobby he enjoyed with great enthusiasm.

Brandon was known for his outgoing personality and warm spirit, and he loved to socialize, having a natural ability to connect with others and leave a lasting impression wherever he went. He was a proud Mason who was raised to the degree of Master Mason in 2011 and later served as Worshipful Master of Central Masonic Lodge #229 AFM in 2015. Above all, Brandon loved his family dearly, especially his children, who were the center of his world.

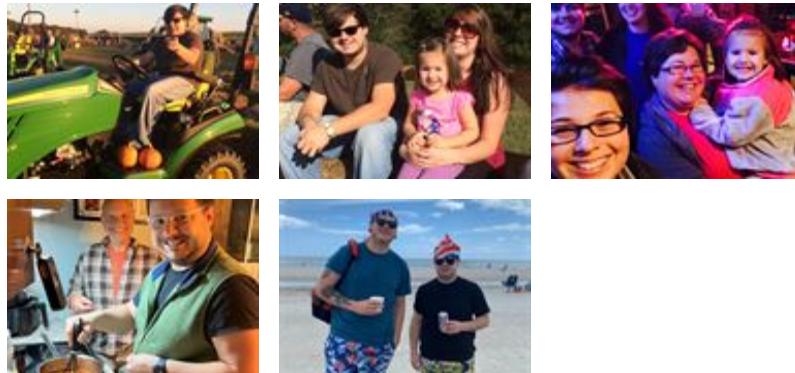

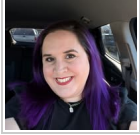
I will miss our phone calls, my brother—our conversations about music, the stock market, and cigars. It’s heartbreaking to grow close to someone and then lose them so suddenly.
