Lois Lehmann, of Salem, SC (formerly Edison, NJ and Jensen Beach, FL) died on February 2, 2023 in the presence of her family. Born in Jersey City, NJ on October 17, 1939, she is survived by her husband, George, whom she loved greatly and would have been married for ten years on February 16, 2023.

She was preceded in death by her sister, Joyce Devine of Rutherford, NJ. Surviving, her daughter Heather Vazquez and her husband Lucio, of Champaign, IL, her son, Dr. Kevin Finneran and his wife Stephanie, of Clemson, SC, and her stepson, Eric and his wife Silissa of Brooklyn, NY.
