Madison Parrish (Pat) Sarratt was born May 11, 1954, and passed away at home peacefully at age 71 on August 14, 2025. He was the son of Madison G. Sarratt and Ruth P. Sarratt from Easley, SC. Growing up Pat attended East End Elementary School and Easley Junior High and High School in Easley, SC. He is survived by sisters, Judith S. Brown of Kingsport, TN, Bobbi S. 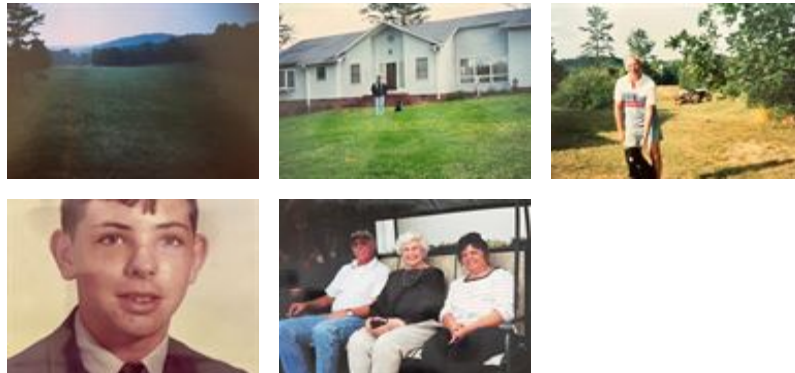
